Displaying this flag is an easy way to support Marin's LGBTQ+ youth!

Happy Pride Month! This year it's more important than ever to show our support of our local LGBTQ youth. When you fly a Pride flag during the month of June, you help signal to our LGBTQ+ community members (especially those not yet out) that we support them. Please join us! Post this in the window of your car, home or business.

Flying a Pride flag helps to raise public visibility for the LGBTQ+ community and helps young people feel that their identity is accepted. This is especially important in Marin as nearly 1 in 6 youth will likely identify as LGBTQ+ before they finish high school. It's likely you know a young person who is not yet out to you, and looking for a signal that it's safe to do so. While Marin is generally accepting, we are not visible in our support, and there is much to improve.

The isolation caused by COVID-19 has hit LGBTQ+ youth especially hard, and their struggle is largely invisible. Since the start of the pandemic, 70% of LGBTQ youth said their mental health was "poor" most of the time or always, and 42% have seriously considered suicide. The Marin Flag Project was started after Pride flags were torn down off the Sir Francis Drake Blvd overpass FIVE TIMES in June 2020.
